Every Kid in a Park

Beginning September 1, and continuing through August 31, 2016, every fourth grader in the U.S., and the family members traveling with them, will have free access to more than 2000 national parks, national forests, national wildlife refuges, and other public lands. The program is called "Every Kid in a Park" and the purpose is to help kids in fourth grade learn history, culture, and science while exploring the great outdoors. The program was created through a partnership of eight federal agencies.

The Every Kid in a Park website at www.everykidinapark.gov will go live on September 1, 2015, and include a link where fourth graders can print out the free pass.

The Oklahoma Native Plant Society (ONPS) was founded in 1987 to encourage the study, protection, propagation, appreciation, and use of the state's native plants. The society's varied activities include field trips, lectures, workshops, displays, and roadside plantings.

ONPS raises money through the sale of the Color Oklahoma special license plates.



The license plate costs \$35, plus a \$3 mailing fee. Twenty dollars of every Color Oklahoma tag sold goes to ONPS.
