## Hazardous Waste Disposal Day

On Saturday, June 24, the Oklahoma Environ-  
mental Management Authority (OEMA) will  
hold a hazardous waste disposal day for  
residents of Canadian county. The site is  
located at 1505 South Rock Island in El Reno,  
and will be open from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Items that will be accepted include latex and  
oil-based paints, paint solvents, motor oil, anti-  
freeze, household batteries (NiCad, alkaline,  
and lithium), fluorescent bulbs, pesticides and  
herbicides, and common household cleaners.  
Items should be in original containers, if  
possible.

Items not accepted include tires, electronics,  
automotive batteries, appliances, commercial  
and construction waste, ammunition or other  
explosives, mercury, and unlabeled materials.

Although the hazardous waste is accepted for  
free, donations are welcome and appreciated.

## Master Gardener Training

The Master Gardener program trains volunteers with an interest in gardening so they can help county extension centers meet requests from the public for horticulture information.

Master Gardeners receive approximately 60 hours of classroom instruction from Oklahoma State University state and county horticulture specialists in gardening, lawn care, fruit production, landscaping, tree planting and care, pruning, insect and disease control, vegetable production, flower bed care, soil improvement, and other horticulture areas. In addition to a complete set of OSU horticulture fact sheets, books and additional publications are also provided.

After the class, participants complete 28 hours of service and 32 hours of phone duty to receive their Master Gardener certification. Each year thereafter requires 20 hours of service and 20 hours of education to maintain certification.

A Master Gardener class will meet from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. every Wednesday from August 30 to November 15, 2017, at the Canadian County Fairgrounds Education Building, 218 N Country Club Rd, in El Reno. Applications are due by July 31, 2017.

A non-refundable registration fee of \$100 is not due until after interviews and acceptance into the course. Master Gardeners who have completed their hours of service and phone duty can re-take the course without charge.
