## Pushing the Limit of Connections

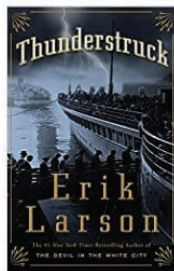
The last in a four-part series on Pushing the Limit will be held on Thursday, May 18, at 6:00 p.m. at the Piedmont library.

A free copy of *Thunderstruck* will be given to registrants while supplies last.

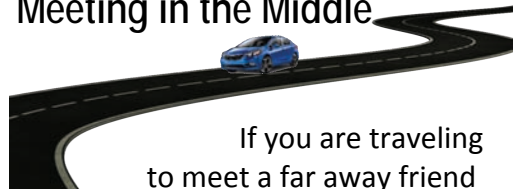
## Preparing for a Disaster: Important Documents & Prescription Information

Scan your important documents (birth certificate, Social Security card, marriage record, driver's license, etc.) and attach them to an email. In the body of the email, list the medications and supplements you take, and the dosages, then send the email to yourself. If your documents or medications are destroyed in a disaster, you will have access to the information anywhere you can access your email account.

You can also use your cell phone to take a picture of your prescription medicine bottles and vitamin bottles, making sure to get both the name of the medication or supplement and the dosage. The next time you are at the doctor's office and are asked to list the medications and supplements you are taking, you will have an easily accessible list.
