## Chisholm Trail Celebration

On Saturday, October 21, from 10:30 to 4:30 p.m., a festival at Express Ranches, located at 2202 N. 11th Street in Yukon, will celebrate the 150th Anniversary of the Chisholm Trail.

The day will begin with 150 horseback riders wearing period clothing and accompanied by the Express Clydesdales. Riders will include former Governors, state and local civic leaders, noted Oklahoma ranchers, mounted law enforcement, western celebrities and regular horse men and women who want to experience the historic Chisholm Trail.

There will be an authentic chuck wagon and modern food trucks. Artists with the Oklahoma City Lyric Theatre will perform hits from musicals including Oklahoma, Will Rogers Follies, and Annie Get Your Gun. Storytellers will entertain with tales of the trail. There will also be hands-on-learning experiences, pony rides, calf roping, bandana making and other Western-themed activities, photo opportunities, and games for families and children.
