## Oklahoma Wildlife Expo

The Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation and other conservation organizations, agencies and sponsors will hold an expo at the Lazy E Arena just north of OKC between Edmond and Guthrie on September 23rd and 24th from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturday and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday. Admission and all activities are free.

The expo provides booths, hands-on exhibits and opportunities which include shooting a bow or shotgun, identifying wildlife tracks and signs, starting a fire without matches, dog training, riding a mountain bike, making a bluebird nest box, camping, fishing knots and casting techniques, bird watching, attracting wildlife, camouflage face painting, and many other topics and activities.

To get to the expo, take the Seward Rd. exit (exit number 151) off I-35, turn right onto Seward Road and follow the signs to the Lazy E. For MapQuest or GPS, use 5600 E. Forrest Hills Rd in Guthrie as the address.
