A Wetland at Night

After the sun goes down on a hot summer day, many kinds of wildlife become more active during the cooler evening hours.

The Hackberry Flat Wildlife Management Area is offering a tour to observe what forms of wildlife are active after the sun goes down, and to learn about how the Oklahoma Wildlife Department manages the wetland to provide habitat for wetland-dependent birds and other wildlife.

Visitors will tour the wetland in an open trailer with seats. The tour begins at 7:30 p.m. and concludes at 11:00 p.m. Children must be at least 14 years old to participate. There is no fee but reservations are required.

That night, after the wetland tour, a program will be presented on wildlife migration by Mike Caywood, manager at Alabaster Caverns State Park. If weather permits, telescopes will be set up.
