Take the Pollinator Garden Challenge!

The Canadian County Master Gardeners are looking for people to take part in the “50 Pollinator Gardens Challenge.” To be part of this challenge, you must meet the requirements of either a “Certified Wildlife Habitat” through the National Wildlife Federation (www.nwf.org/garden-for-wildlife), a “Monarch Waystation” through Monarch Watch (www.monarchwatch.org/waystations/certify.html), or a “Butterfly Garden and Habitat” through the North American Butterfly Association (<http://nababutterfly.com/butterfly-garden-certification-program/>). For your garden to qualify, it must be certified between March 1, 2019 and March 1, 2020.

If you are one of the more than 100 people or businesses in Piedmont that have already created a Certified Wildlife Habitat through the National Wildlife Federation, you can simply add the elements needed, if any, and certify it again as either a Monarch Waystation or a Butterfly Garden and Habitat.

Create a Butterfly Garden or Habitat

Whether or not you want to create a butterfly garden that will meet the certification criteria of the North American Butterfly Association, butterflies are fun to watch and a butterfly garden is easy to create.

Do you have at least three kinds of host plants and three kinds of nectar plants (recommended but not required that you have more than one plant of each variety)? Those six plants and \$15 is all it takes to certify your yard as a butterfly habitat and help Canadian County Master Gardeners meet their goal.
